When you went to Prague, you were there, as you said, right after the Velvet Revolution and you were an entrepreneur. In our modern age, we constantly hear terms like startups and hustle and the grind. I don't know if all those terms existed then but that's essentially what you were doing but there was no internet. There was nothing to help you do that.

Anne Marie: Correct.

Jeff: You just figured it out and it takes a lot of courage.

Anne Marie: You know, sometimes things just happen to you also if we are listening and aware but as far as being an entrepreneur, I think I always have been. I was a singer for most of my life before 1989 and had moved to France and talk about entrepreneur, I mean to get gigs. Let's say I'd even have an agent and I did from time to time but still you're very entrepreneurial when you are getting gigs and you're a singer and you are presenting yourself to the world. So then when I went to Prague as a singer, invited by President Václav Havel because I wrote this song and had sent him just the poetry of it. Her husband, my dad, died suddenly in a boating accident and that's why I, you know, I hear people today complain about, oh, I never have a day off with the kids and everything. Well, my mom never had a day off with the kids, you know, she had five of us and to watch her, just watching how she managed, went, got a secretarial job and pinched the pennies and taught us to stand up for ourselves. One of her sayings was never take a back seat to anyone but she didn't suggest we were better than anybody, but we definitely needed to look out for ourselves.

Anne Marie: We also started working very early on because we had to help with, with finances. So, I started babysitting at age 11 and what got me to realize I had to do what my heart, you know, was calling me to do was I read a book by Joseph Campbell and I'm not saying everything traces back to this but it was, it did revolutionize my thinking and Joseph Campbell's a mythologist and he had a saying, follow your bliss and if you follow your bliss, so here's what I would say to anyone and I say it to myself now, follow your bliss and he says doors will open.
